



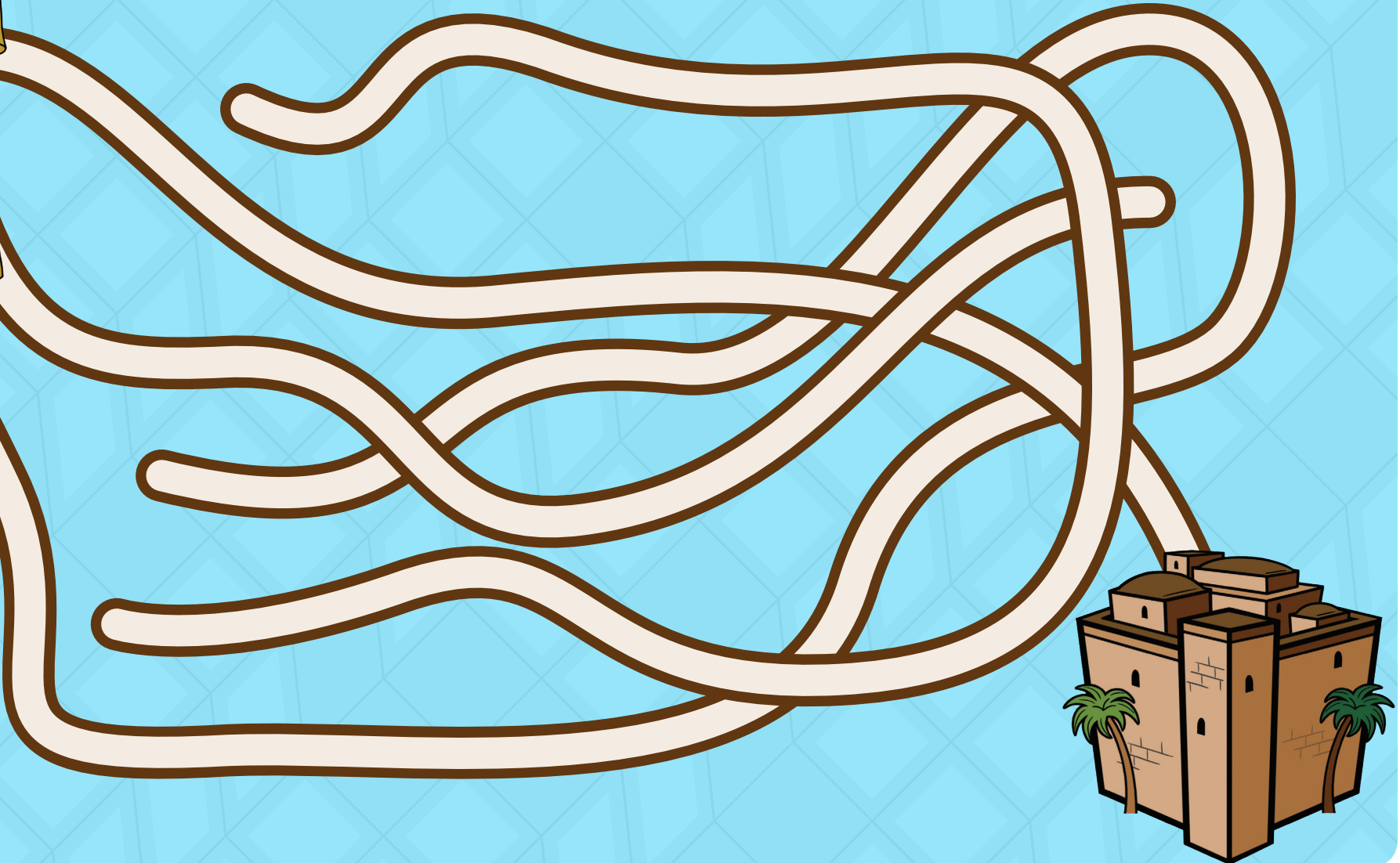

What You Heard *In the Word*

3. What were some things the Pharisees and Sadducees disagreed about? *God, his Word, how they should live/following the ways of the Greeks.*
