Break the Ice:

1. What's the longest and hardest school project you've ever had to do?
2. What did it feel like when you finally finished?

What do I think?

1. In your own words, what does "it is finished" mean to you?
2. In your own words, what does the word justification mean?
3. How does it make you feel that you are eternally secure in your salvation?

What does God say?

1. Read Hebrews 10:1-10 – How do verses 1-4 prove that the Old Testament sacrificial system was a shadow, not the real thing?
2. In verses 5-10 why does it say that Jesus' sacrifice is better?
3. Read Hebrews 10:11-18 – What do these verses say Jesus did with our sin?
4. How long does verse 14 say His sacrifice will last for those who accept it?

What steps will I take?

1. In light of Jesus' loving and powerful finished work on the cross for you, how should you respond to Him?
2. What can you do to be a better witness for Him in this world right now?

Challenge:

This week, spend time thinking about what Christ has done for you on the cross. Think about how He finished and accomplished everything He set out to do. Meditate on what "it is finished" means to you personally. Because of what Jesus has done for you, because He has fully paid your sin debt, wholly and completely give your life to Him. Spend time thanking God for sending Christ to pay the penalty for your sins. Ask God how you can be used by Him to reach more people with the beautiful message that Jesus paid for their sins too.
