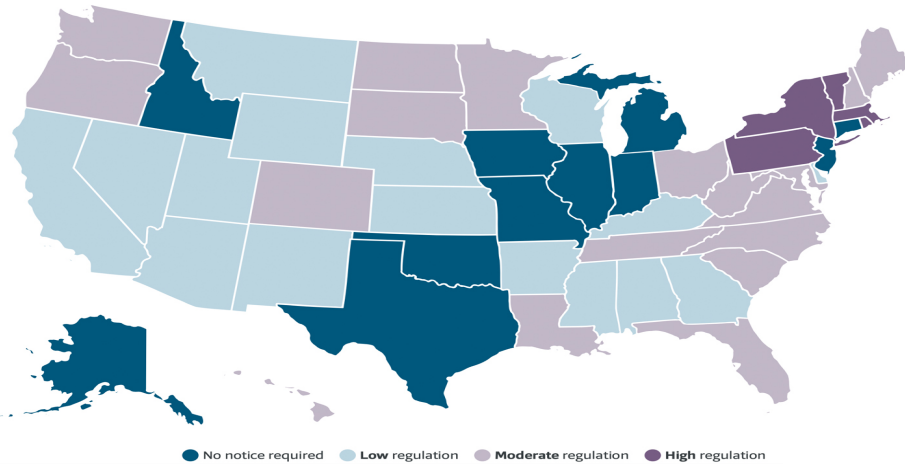
B. You can provide your children with a tutorial educational model.

III. The Legal Situation for Home Schooling



A. Option #1 - - Homeschooling under the homeschool statute.

1. Teach the required subjects for the required time.
2. Maintain records as evidence of instruction.
3. Submit a semi-annual progress report.
4. Ensure your student has access to library facilities.
5. Test your child annually.

If your student does *not* perform well enough on the test to meet the public school standard for advancing to the next grade — the school district will decide *if* your child should be put in a public school, receive handicapped services, or have instruction support for homeschooling at your expense.

B. Option #2 - - Join S.C.A.I.H.S.

1. Join the South Carolina Association of Independent Home Schools.

SCAIHS Basic Membership Fees First Child - \$350
Second and Third Child - \$50 per child
No additional basic charge for four or more children
No charge for K5 student when an older sibling is enrolled
Additional Fees (per student)
High School Fee - \$100/Senior Fee - \$50/Special Needs - \$50

C. Option #3 -- Join a private homeschool association.

- 1. Parents may teach their children at home by becoming members of an association for home schools which has at least 50 members.**
- 2. Bona fide membership & continuing compliance with the Standards of the associations exempt the home school from the further requirements of #1.**
- 3. Community Bible Church Christian Academy is an association that it is both a private and a religiously based association for members of the **church** only.**
