B. Joy is a choice

- 1. Proverbs 17:22
- 2. There is a difference between joy and happiness
 - a. Happiness is related to life going well, conditions being positive
 - b. Joy is not based on the outside but the inside
- 3. Joy "It is not based upon circumstances; it is based upon attitude...Pain is inevitable, but misery is optional. We cannot avoid pain, but we can avoid joy. God has given us such immense freedom that He will allow us to be as miserable as we want to be...I know some people who spend their entire lives practicing being unhappy...They get more mileage from having people feel sorry for them than from choosing to live out their lives in the context of joy."

- D. Salvation should bring us joy Psalm 51:5
 - 1. Rev. 2:1-7
 - 2. "chara" (joy) and "charis" (grace) are closely related
 - 3. Because we experience God's grace, we can experience God's joy

4. We lose our joy when we lose sight of the wonder of our salvation
