- A. An ordinary day v.1
- B. A bush v. 2
 - 1. An ordinary bush
 - 2. What was happening to it was not ordinary
- C. Moses response v.3, "I must turn aside and see why it is not burning up"
 - 1. This burning bush certainly got Moses' attention
 - 2. Sometimes, God uses extraordinary things to grab our attention

D. God's voice

- 1. "When"
 - a. Means at the same time
 - b. When did God speak to Moses?
 - c. Any lessons for us?
- 2. God called to him "Moses, Moses"
- 3. Moses response, "Here I am"
 - a. I am here or it's me
 - b. Some believe it means I am ready
 - c. That was all God wanted to hear from Moses
- 4. God's instructions v.5
 - a. "Don't come near"
 - b. "Take off your sandals"
 - c. "You are standing on holy ground"

- 5. "Holy" means separated
 - a. Separated from God /unapproachable
 - b. Separated from Moses' past
 - c. Separated from Moses' plans and ways
 - d. Separated from himself
- 6. "I am the God of your father" v.6 a. father =
 - b. "the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and Jacob"
 - c. What did God declare by that?
- 7. At that moment, Moses hid his face
 - a. Why?
 - b. This is also the God who had told Moses he would lead the people out of Egypt
- E. God's revelation v.7
 - 1. "I have seen the affliction of my people"
 - 2. "and have given heed to their cry"
 - 3."I am aware of their suffering"
 - 4. What does that tell you about God?
 - 5. What would that tell Moses about God?
 - F. God's declaration v.8
 - 1. "I have come down to deliver them"
 - 2. "and to bring them up to a good and spacious land"
 - 3. Who will do it?
 - 4. What do you think Moses thought at that moment?

- 5. This is a message that Moses' time in the desert and his time of preparation was over
- 6. God was ready to deliver the people and Moses was now ready as well

WHAT DO WE LEARN?

IV. GOD'S CALL UPON MOSES v.9, 10

- A. In v. 9, God again states that He has seen the affliction of His people
- B. In v. 8, God declared that He had come down to deliver His people
- C. In v. 10, God declares that He is going to use Moses to accomplish this
 1. I am going to do it and I need a man to work through and you are him
 2. Notice the words "come now"

V. MOSES' OBJECTIONS TO GOD'S CALL

- #1 Excuse "Who am I? v.11,12
 - A. Moses remembered his past failures
 - 1. I tried this before God, and it did not work
 - 2. By the way, God often uses people who have failed. He seems to specialize in that.
 - 3. Abraham, Moses, Jonah, Rahab, David, Peter, us
 - B. He is stating a complete lack of qualification to do this
 - 1. Who am I?
 - 2. It is a rhetorical question that expects the answer "nobody"
 - 3. 2 Corinthians 4:7 earthen vessels= clay pots

- 4. Ephesians 1:11
- 5. 2 Chronicles 16:9

C. Why do we often resist such an amazing God who wants to use us?

- 1. Moses was not hearing God correctly
- 2. He only heard, "I will send you"
- 3. What part did he miss or ignore?
- D. God's answer v.12
 - 1. "Certainly"= for
 - 2. "I will be with you"
 - 3. "and this shall be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you
 - 4. "You shall worship God at this mountain"
 - 5. "at this mountain"

#2 Excuse-"I will not have all the answers" v.13

- A. I will say to them "the God of your fathers has sent me to you"
 - 1. When did Moses try to present that idea to them earlier?
 - 2. Acts 7:25
- B. "What is His name?"
 - 1. Moses knew that he needed an authority behind him
 - 2. At one time, Moses' name carried great authority and weight in Egypt
- C. "What shall I say to them?"
 - 1. What answer can I give them?
 - 2. Exodus 19:13-17
- D. God's answer v.14

- 1. "I am that I am"
- 2. The self-existent, eternal, living God
- 3. The God of history, eternity
- 4. The intimate God
- 5. "Tell them I AM has sent me to you"
- E. God went on in v.15 to say that, "The LORD, the God of your fathers" has sent me to you"
 - 1."LORD"=Yahweh, the personal name of God
 - 2. "the God"=Elohim
 - 3. "of your fathers" =
 - 4. "the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob"
- F. v. 16, 17 God tells Moses to inform the people God sees their bondage
 - 1. "I am indeed concerned"=
 - 2. Why would that be important to the people of Israel?
 - 3. God would bring them out of Egypt and into a land flowing with milk and honey"
 - 4. "milk and honey" v.17=
 - 5. Why would that be important to the people?
- G. God further said in v. 18, "They will pay heed to you"
 - 1. What is God assuming here?
 - 2. God will prove to the people that Moses is His representative
 - 3. God tells Moses that he with the elders will go to the king of Egypt
 - 4. What is God laying out for Moses?
- H. Moses and the elders were to start by making a moderate request of Pharaoh v. 18

1. "Please" v.18

- 2. To be able to leave for three days to offer sacrifices to the LORD
- 3. God will stretch out His hand and strike Egypt with all His miracles
- 4. Why would God tell Moses this about Pharaoh at this time?
- I. In v. 21,22, God would give the people favor, respect in the sight of the Egyptian people
 - 1. This favor or respect would be caused by the fear of them being further punished by God
 - 2. So the Egyptian people would do all they could to help hasten the Israelites leaving Egypt
 - 3. Even to the point of the Egyptians giving them their riches

Excuse #3 I don't have the credentials to do this 4:1-9

A. Moses was still not convinced the people would believe him v.1

- 1. "For they may say, 'The Lord has not appeared to you.' "
- 2. Moses believed he needed to have something more

B. God's response v.2-5

- 1. "a staff'= shepherd's staff
- 2. God would use that staff as a declaration of authority
- 3. If he cast it on the ground it became a serpent v.3
- 4. God told Moses to pick it up. Dangerous
- 5. By the way, the Egyptians worshipped serpents
- 6. What message was God sending to the Egyptians through this rod, serpent v.5?
- C. Next, God told Moses to put his hand into his bosom v.6-8

- 1. Moses did, and the hand became leprous v.6
- 2. When he put it in his bosom again, it came back to normal
- D. The serpent and the leprosy are called "signs" by God v.8
- E. If they did not believe the first two signs then Moses was to perform a third one v.9
 - 1. He was to take water out of the Nile River and pour it on the ground
 - 2. The water would become blood on the dry ground
- #4 Excuse "I am not eloquent v.10-12
 - A. Moses was saying that he was not equipped to go to Pharaoh
 - 1. "eloquent"=
 - 2. "slow of speech"=
 - 3. "slow of tongue"=
 - 4. He sensed that his speech was slow or that he stuttered
 - 5. How could he represent God if he was not good at speaking
 - 6. Contrast that with Acts 7:22, "Moses was a man of power in words"
 - B. God's response v. 11,12
 - 1. Who made man's mouth?
 - 2. "Or who makes him mute or deaf or seeing or blind?
 - 3. "Is it not I, the LORD?
 - 4. Psalm 139:13-16
 - 5. "I will be with your mouth and teach you what you are to say."
- #5 Excuse "Send someone else"
 - A. He just did not want to be the one God sent v.13

- 1. He was willing to go but wanted God to send someone else to speak for him
- 2. This shows the attitude that was behind all of his other excuses
- 3. Egypt for Moses represented risk.
- 4. Moses' response was not rebellion, nor one of humility but one of timidity
- 5. 2 Timothy 1:7
- B. God's response v. 14-17
 - 1. His anger burned v.14
 - 2. God would send Moses' brother, Aaron to speak for Moses
 - 3. Aaron would supply the skill that Moses thought he lacked
 - 4. Aaron would do the speaking, but Moses would receive the message from God for Aaron to give v.15, 16
 - 5. Aaron may have been a good speaker, but he lacked obedience himself
 - 6. Exodus 32:1-5
- C. Moses demonstrated weakness here, but God would use him greatly.
